Rules

Play in groups of four or five.

You need a die for each group and one counter for each player.

- 1 Take turns to throw the die and move to a square.
- 2 Follow the instructions on the square.
- 3 Explain the meaning of the word(s) in **bold** to the other players. If you explain the word(s) correctly (according to the other players or your teacher), you get 10 points.
- 4 If another player has already landed on the square and explained the word(s) in **bold**, you can't earn the extra points.
- 5 You needn't throw the exact number to reach Finish. The first player to reach Finish gets 100 points. The second player gets 60 points.

 The third player gets 30 points.
- 6 When the third player reaches Finish, the game ends. The winner is the player with the most points.
